

PLAYING THE C HUNGARIAN GYPSY SCALE IN THE TREBLE CLEF, ON THE MARIMBA

Complete the following steps to play the C Hungarian gypsy scale in the treble clef,
on the marimba.

1. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **left hand** on the **middle C**.
2. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **right hand** on the **D**.
3. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **left hand** on the **E \flat** .
4. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **right hand** on the **F \sharp** .
5. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **left hand** on the **G**.
6. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **right hand** on the **A \flat** .
7. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **left hand** on the **B \flat** .
8. Strike the marimba with the mallet in your **right hand** on the **C**.
